## JFK aftermath in the news

the StarNews archives

50 years ago  
Dec. 1, 1963: A little more than a week after President Kennedy's assassination, the Star ran a story from United Press International reporting that Mrs. Kennedy, 54, and her two children, Carolyn, 6, and John Jr., 3, remained in seclusion at the Kennedy compound in Hyannis, Mass., which had just been battered by a storm with near-hurricane strength winds.  
Dec. 1, 1963: In church news, the Rev. W.C. Lamb had accepted the call as pastor at Sunset Park Baptist Church.

Dec. 1, 1963: In local golf news, it was reported that the city was considering fighting nine holes of the city golf course. Anyone recall what happened to that idea? If you do, drop me a line.  
Dec. 5, 1963: Some smaller news items about the JFK assassination were still finding a place on the Star's front page. On this date there were three-cessed children of the Kennedys, one a stillborn girl in 1950 and the other a boy who died two days after his birth several months before the assassination, were moved from a cemetery in Brookline, Mass., and interred beside their father at Arlington National Cemetery. It also was noted that \$6,000 had been raised for the benefit of Lee Harvey Oswald's widow, Marina, who was still receiving protection from the Secret Service. Finally, it was reported that Capt. Michael Groves, who led the military honor guards for the state funeral and observances leading up to it, died of
